### Comments

This course was a helpful overview of the basics of probability and statistics. While most of the material was not new to me, I understand why having a basic understanding of the material is a must for higher level economics courses.

The course was a good opne, just that it didn't seem that hand in hand with the problem sets.

The course was pretty interesting but due to it being a mandatory pass/fail students didn't put much effort into it.

Professor Porter is clearly brilliant. He teaches very organized, takes time to get to know his students, and is enthusiastic about teaching. He communicates with his students with his expectations are, so nothing on the homework is a surprise.

He is an amazing, gifted professor. Ability to relate to his students well.

This course covered a lot of material in a very short time. Professor Porter did a great job covering so many topics in just a few months. One weakness is that we sped through so many topics and didn't go too in–depth on many of them.

The voulme of material is the same as a statistics class while compressed to a half semester timeline. Although the pacing is faster it is possible to learn at the faster pace with increased effort. Although it would have been nice to dive deeper into some of the concepts of the course, everything that was covered was comprehensive despite the timeline.

Problem sets were very helpful, however he over complicated some topics .

One strength of the course was the pacing, we had ample time to go over examples for each concept. No weaknesses for this course.

The material is fairly challenging, but the pace moves pretty fast. But, this is because of how short the term is.

The course was good and encompassed a lot of essential topics. I feel it was a bit fast–paced, however, with the last week being especially demanding. Maybe the last problem set should be spaced out a bit more rather than being in the same week as the test and mini project.

The class is too easy. Just teach this stuff in the first week of econ300! No way a half credit course is needed for this. It was a waste of my time.

He looks to go above and beyond to help his students succeed in the course. He is very helpful and one of the best professors I have had at Wesleyan.

Teaching was great.

Professor Porter is clearly very enthusiastic and knowledgable in his teaching. I appreciate how he truly cares about his students and he wants us to do well. He did a good job recognizing that this course is pass/fail, so feedback on problems is way more important than grades. I really liked how much he used the whiteboard—I sometimes miss notes because I am a slow writer, and I really appreciated how he would write every little thing on the board.

Professor Porter is clearly passionate and knowledgeable about his field. He used examples throughout that made difficult concepts easy to understand. He was flexible on his time available outside of class—often extending his office hours or moving them to accommodate our class.

Very clear and understandable, however over explained some topics.

One strength of the teacher was the ability to explain each topic very well. No weaknesses.

Professor Porter is extremely passionate about the material of this class, and his personality makes his class more engaging. But, one thing that he could improve on is more clearly explaining the material, and walking through the steps of his math more clearly. He should also make sure to clearly give us the equations for theorems.

Professor Porter was very good at communicating information and engaging with the class in order to do so. He is always readily available to give students more help if needed outside class hours, and he is very passionate about what he teaches with the goal of ensuring that all his students understand the lesson well. I didn't recognize any weakness in the teaching.

Porter is great, clearly he is overqualified for this instruction. But so are most people! This stuff is too easy!

Professor Porter did a great time teaching this course for the first time!


No other comments about this course.

The class is too easy. Just teach this stuff in the first week of econ300! No way a half credit course is needed for this. It was a waste of my time.




What percentage of class sessions did you attend/view?




